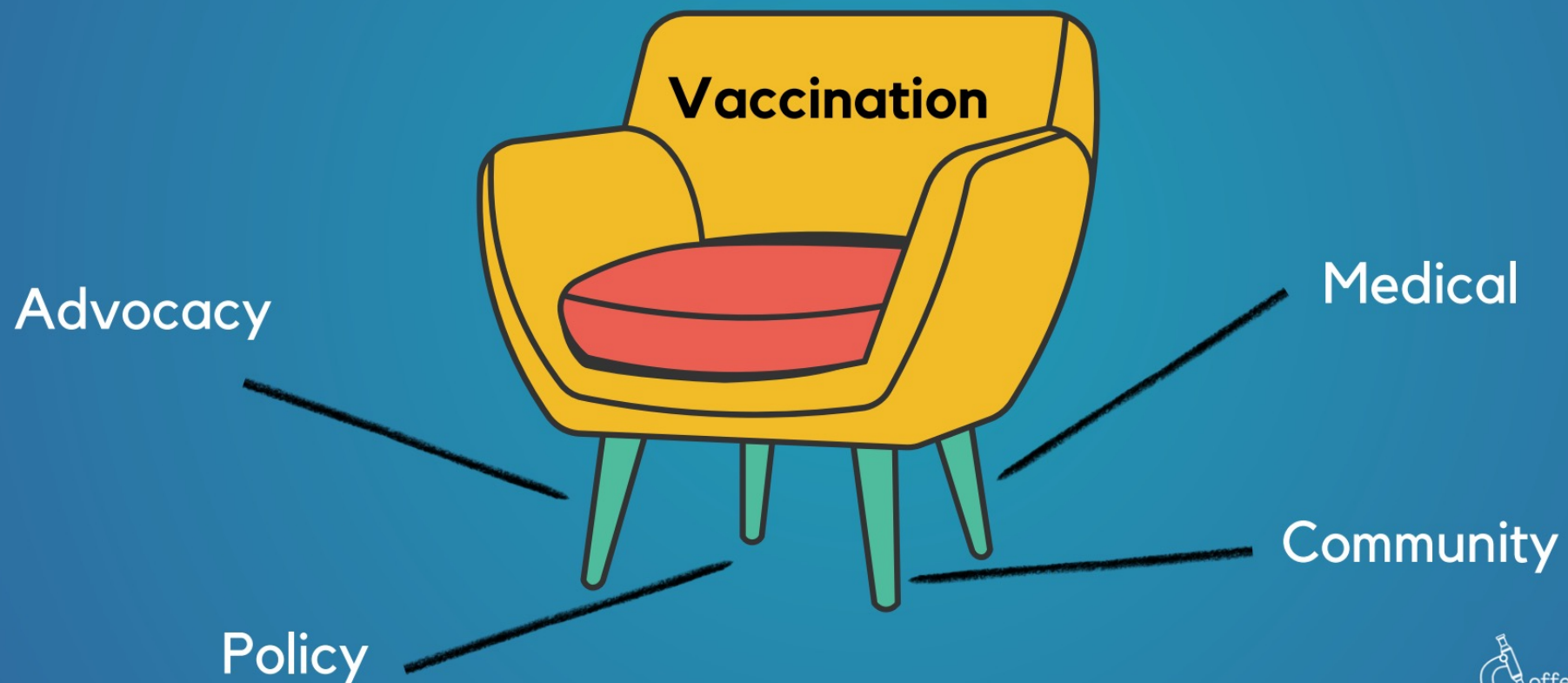

BCHIP Homebound Vaccine Program

- Vaccines provided include: Flu, COVID-19, RSV, and shingles.
- Partner with a local independent pharmacy to provide vaccines.
- All appointments are scheduled through BCHIP and are determined by geographic area of the county for best utilization of time.
- Insurance is billed for vaccines. Independent BCHIP funds are used for clients identified without insurance.
- Key stakeholders include:
 - Bucks County Area Agency on Aging
 - Bucks County Department of Health
 - Bucks County Senior Housing
 - Bucks County Center for Independent Living
 - Home health agencies including palliative care
- Outcomes to date: 419 vaccines including 40 RSV vaccines and 15 Shingles vaccines. (remaining vaccines are COVID-19 and flu)
- Continue outreach efforts to organizations supporting seniors and homebound residents to increase utilization of the program.

- Serving the Plain (Amish & Mennonite), uninsured and medical-assistance population since the 1990s
- Located within 3 partner fire halls in rural areas of Lancaster County
- Childhood and adolescent immunizations are offered within the DOH Vaccines For Children (VFC) program
- Appointments and walk-ins accepted
- **Calendar Year 2023:**
 - 1,192 vaccines administered
 - 443 encounters

- We are devoted advocates for pediatric vaccination and focus on the importance of being vaccinated against polio and *all* crippling childhood diseases.



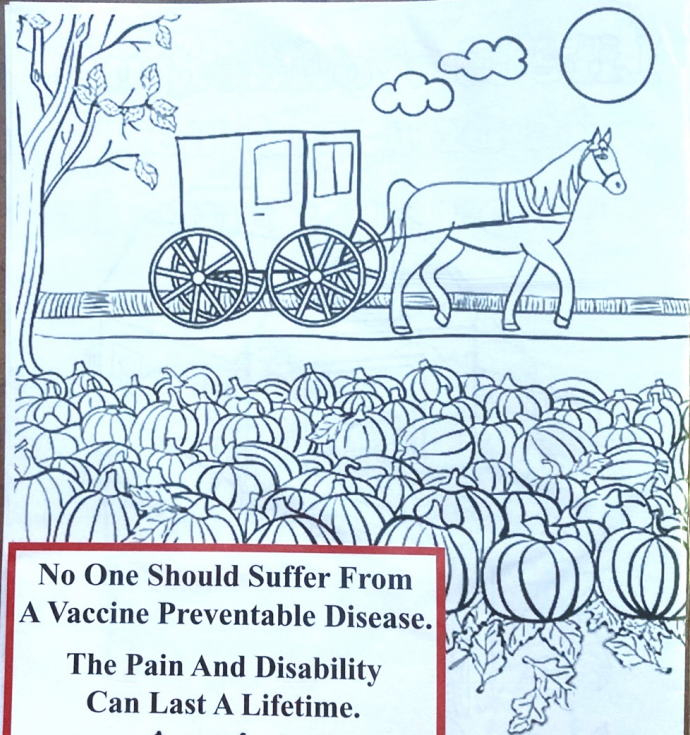

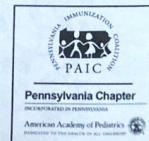

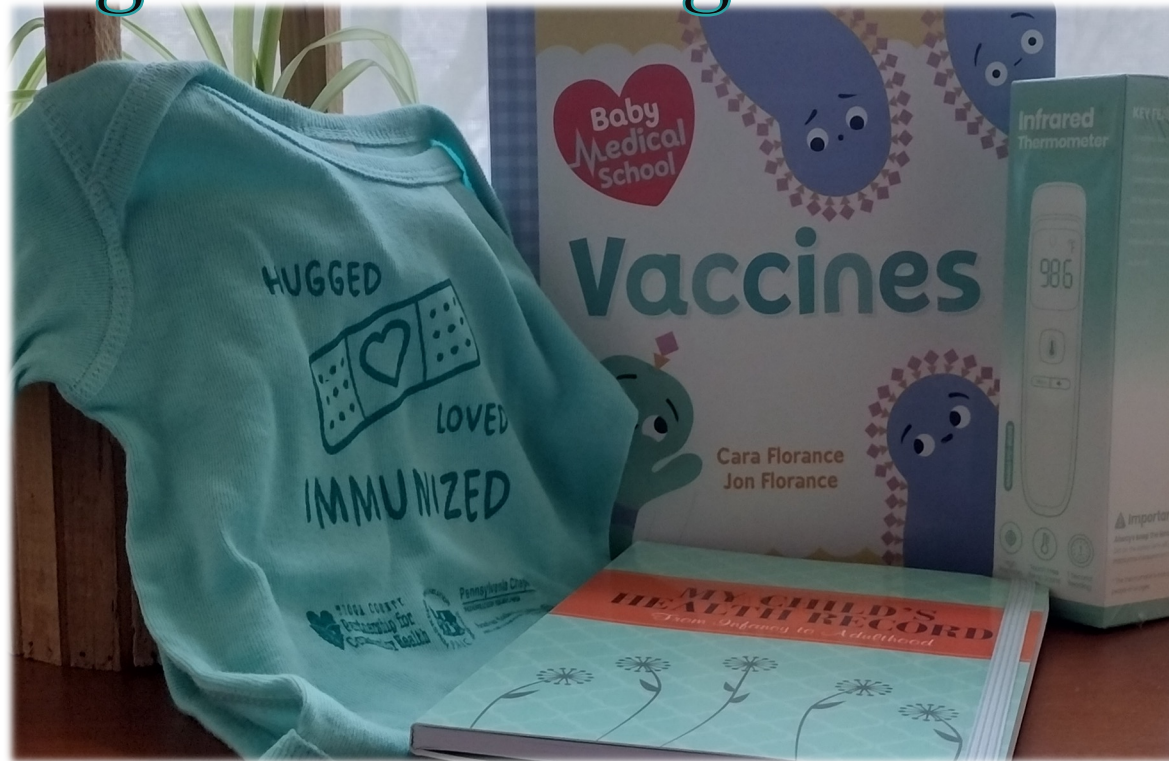


STRATEGIES WE ARE USING TO ENGAGE

- + Virtual Webinars reach a large audience who may not be able to attend an event but still need access to information. Recordings are posted online.
- + Clinics happen at churches, after Worship Services or during community festivals so that we go to where the audience is already frequenting
- + Offering educational events in addition to clinics provides a way to interact with those unaware of our events. We advertise the clinics and encourage attendance.
- + Newly implemented a Homebound Program where a pharmacist comes to the home for an appointment with someone unable to access a clinic.

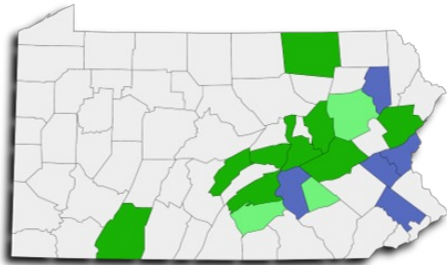
